Happy New Year, Everybody! I hope you all had a safe and fun holiday. New Year's is always a time when we look ahead to the coming year. But before we look ahead we need to take a look back at the year just completed.

2010 was a very eventful year for the Kansas City Woodworkers' Guild. We have continued to see our membership numbers grow to nearly 400. We followed up on the successes of Kelly Mehler and Marc Adams with classes by Ben Hobbs on building a Pencil Post Bed, John Wilson on building oval Shaker boxes, and woodcarving for furniture with Nora Hall. Besides our always great programs at our monthly membership meetings, we learned how to do things really small with Bill Robertson.

2010 also saw the beginning of our move into the education game as we started our first classes, in woodworking, for home-schooled students. Not to be left out, there was our first Machine Woodworking class for the adults. Both of these classes were taught by our Director of Education, Kara Paris. I have had the pleasure of being at a couple of Kara's classes, helping

out, and was quite impressed with the work the students are turning out. I'm sure we can expect some new "Show and Tell" presenters in the near future. Along with these classes, we've begun to offer clinics and workshops, to our membership, taught by other members.

Besides all these great educational opportunities, our shop has seen growth as well. New planer, miter saw, thickness sander, spindle sander, and new, improved dust collection. Even a couple of new workbenches, built by member Rob Young, grace our shop's floor.

All of this doesn't come cheap. While tuition covers most of the classes, more money was needed to pay rent, utilities, and to keep our shop going. Well, we ran into some good luck when, former Guild President, Mike Jones got tired of cleaning up messes left by sub standard sample boxes. You see, Mike works for Field Turf, the artificial turf people. Each sample box not only contains turf, but the sand and granulated rubber that is its base.

Awards Presentations

Three awards are typically given by the Guild at the end of the year. These awards are: **Lifetime Achievement Award**, **Contributor of the Year**, and **Member of the Year**. This award winner is one of the Member of the Month honorees, decided by the 12 honorees themselves.

This year's **Lifetime Achievement** winner was **Bill Evans**. Bill has spent countless hours helping the Guild over the last 8 years. He has served as Director of Programs, the person responsible for the monthly general programs, and presently serves as Assets Director, the person responsible for acquiring and maintaining the Guild's equipment and shop. He has given a program presentation at one of the monthly meetings and also has conducted several workshops and classes for the Guild. The **Member of the Year** award winner was **Chuck Saunders**. He serves as Events Director, and is a founding member of the CNC SIG. .

Rough to Ready Wood Preparation Clinic

January 15, 2011

9 AM - 12 Noon

This clinic is intended to help the woodworker understand the steps involved in preparing wood for making a project. It begins with the selection of wood, describing the benefits of using rough sawn or already milled stock and include some guidelines about ordering or buying wood. Next, there will be a demonstration on how to arrange project pieces on stock before it is milled. This clinic offers advice on selecting pieces best used for common applications like stiles and rails, for panels and getting the best grain orientation and appearance. Techniques and procedures will be discussed and demonstrated for milling the stock, using the miter saw, bandsaw, jointer, planer, and table saw. Some hand tool methods will also be used to illustrate you don't need to shop full of large equipment. And finally, time permitting, there will be an exercise to properly glue up a panel with particular emphasis on the use of clamps and adhesive.

The Turf Box Project

Past President, Mike Jones, brought us the Turf Box Project in 2010. Essentially we contracted to make wooden boxes that will hold artificial turf samples. We produced and shipped, over three weeks, some 500 boxes, earning the guild over \$3,500. We will be making another 1,500 similar boxes in 2011 that will bring into our Treasury \$10,000 to \$15,000. Separately, currently subcontracted, we are producing a number of 'briefcase' style turf boxes and may make more of these later in the year ourselves. This project rivals, and will eventually exceed, the Andre's Project that got the Guild, as we know it today, financially started.

We will start the next phase of the Turf Box Project, consisting of making 750 boxes, in mid-January, finishing mid-February. This is definitely not just a Guild money making project. Participants will have the opportunity learn and develop their skills in box making, using the table saw to size and rebating, planing to thickness, precision mitering, assembly and glue-up, silk screening, and final fit and finish.

Volunteer for the Turf Box Project!

A variety of times will be available from which to choose to volunteer to work on the Turf Box Project at the Shop. Times will be available in the morning, afternoon, or evenings. You should be able to choose areas for your personal skill development as well.

Announcing "Guildshares"

Due to the amount of resources needed to take advantage of this Guild Funding opportunity (Turf Box Project) the Board has authorized the issuance of "**Guildshares**" to members for each hour of volunteer work. While the income from the Turf Box Project will benefit the Guild, part of the expenses built into the project will be spent on "**Guildshares**". While the exact value of **Guildshares** has not been finalized, the Guildshare expenses build into each box is \$1.50. Members who work on the box project will receive these **Guildshares** to use on any personal Guild expense including dues, Guild logo ware, classes & workshops, virtually any Guild activity where money changes hands.

Members, volunteering for the Turf Box Project, will sign in and out, in order to record hours volunteered. Members will regularly be advised, via email, of the number of Guildshares available for exchange for Guild fee services.

Background

At the Kansas City Woodworkers' Guild we have been fortunate, compared to other Guilds around the country, to be able to afford the cost of occupying our 10,000 square feet of space, shared with the Kansas City Woodturners, for our well equipped shop and meetings. Next year's budget shows the Guild will be spending about \$30,000 on rent & utilities, additional tools and shop expenses, and the many benefits that our members enjoy. At the December meeting, President Kevin Thomas announced that we were able to put \$15,000 into a "Building Acquisition Fund".

All of this has been produced through the ingenuity and hard & generous volunteer work of our members.

Some of the milestones that funded our Guild started with the Andre's Project where we made tables, benches, and chairs. This allowed us to confidently equip our shop with tools and audio visual equipment, pay rent for two years, and embark on other projects such as bringing in top niche woodworkers from around the country like Kelly Mehler, Marc Adams, and Ben Hobbs for weekend workshops.

This past year, 2010, was a great year with additional milestones including growth to over 400 members, an extremely successful auction generating over \$14,000 shared with the Turners to pay rent, and the Turf Box project where we made 500 boxes and earned over \$3,500 while acquiring additional shop tools. Members hard work, along with the confidence and determination to move forward, has provided us in 2010 with a trip to the home of Woodsmith/Shopnotes, John Wilson, the Shaker Boxmaker, Bill Robertson's Miniature Woodworking, fill 10 booths at the Working Show, Lie-Nielsen Hand Tool Event, Open House Day, Old World Finishing with Randy Bohn, and Nora Hall, Master Woodcarver. We also enjoyed numerous classes, clinics, and workshops including the making hand planes, woodworking tool tune-ups, and two 13-week woodworking courses, one for Home Schooled Students and another for adults. In addition, we have added two Special Interest Groups bringing our total to four ... CNC Routing, Handtools, Scroll Saw, and Shopsmith. Three of these SIGs have received significant donations of tools to facilitate the the activities of the SIGs.

We have indeed been fortunate ... we made it happen ... through hard work, imagination, determination, and the fortitude of our members.

How will we continue to build and fund the Guild and produce the accustomed benefits of membership in 2011? Can we earn funding to contribute additional funds to acquire our own building when we need it? YES! By Volunteering your services and getting involved, we continue to make the Kansas City Woodworkers' Guild the best in the Country.
